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Materials List

Bring any painting materials you already have that you would like to use. The following painting items are recommended if you are new to painting. Demonstrations will be in oil and/or watercolor depending on student interest.

Paints Individual tubes of professional grade paints are recommended. The basic formula of these recommendations is to have a warm and cool version of each of the following colors: red, yellow, blue, green, and neutral.

If you are just starting out, colors listed in **BOLD* will be sufficient, or you can find a starter set.

- Cadmium Red
- **Alizarin Crimson***
- **Cadmium Yellow Light ***
- Yellow Ochre
- **French Ultramarine Blue***
- Prussian Blue
- Windsor Green Yellow Shade
- Chrome Oxide Green
- **Viridian Green***
- **Burnt Sienna***
- **Sepia***
- Payne's Gray

Palette Folded Plastic, with empty compartments for your paint is recommended for watercolor. A wooden or disposable palette is recommended for oil or acrylic.

Brushes At least 3 sizes, Large - size 12 or larger, Medium - size 6, Small - Rigger. Round brushes are recommended to start.

Surface A Block of Watercolor paper, 9 x 12 inches, or a small canvas or board for oil and acrylic.

Sketchbook (5 x 7 inches or larger) If you already have one, bring it!

Pencil 2B recommended.

Eraser Kneaded eraser or plastic recommended.

Solvent FOR OIL PAINTS. Turpenoid or Spike Oil recommended.

Medium FOR OIL AND ACRYLIC PAINTS.

Container(s) For watercolor, one container with a wide mouth. For Oil and acrylic, two small containers for solvent/water and for medium.

Other Materials:

Rags and/or absorbent paper towels

Hat

Bug spray

Water bottle
